Yes, he does. No, he doesn't. No, we mustn't. MUST is an auxiliary verb. HAVE TO is not an auxiliary verb. Use MUST/MUSTN'T in negatives/questions. Use DO/DID in negatives and questions. 🔀 We don't must arrive early. 🗙 He hadn't to wear a uniform. ✓ We mustn't arrive early. 🕜 He didn't have to wear a uniform. MUST has no past or future forms. Use HAD TO to talk about the past and Use HAD TO and WILL HAVE TO. WILL HAVE TO to talk about the future. X Yesterday I must go to the dentist. 🕜 Yesterday I had to go to the dentist. 🗶 I will must speak to her tomorrow. 📝 I will have to speak to her tomorrow.

MUST

Obligation that comes from the speaker. The speaker thinks it's necessary.

MANAGER: You must be here at 7.

SMOKER*: I must stop smoking.

*The obligation comes from the smoker. The

HAVE TO

External obligation. Another person thinks it's necessary.

WORKER: I have to be there at 7.

SMOKER*: I have to stop smoking.

*The obligation comes from the doctor. The doctor thinks it's necessary.

MUSTN'T

Prohibition. You can't do something. It's necessary that you don't do it.

You mustn't wait here.

smoker thinks it's necessary.

You can't wait here. It's not allowed.

He mustn't call her at work.

He can't call her at work. It's necessary that he doesn't call her at work.

DON'T HAVE TO

No obligation. You can do something but you don't need to do it. Not necessary.

You don't have to wait here.
You don't need to wait here. Not necessary.

He doesn't have to call her at work.

He doesn't need to call her if he doesn't want to do it. It's not necessary.
